Item	Discussion	Action
1. Site Visit	The Board visited Brockenhurst and East Boldre to look at parking issues on the Forest verges, and how the car free ditching has been renewed. It appears the bigger issue is loss of grass on the verges due to parking by residents, visitors and tourists on the verges. There is also a number of instances where commercial parking (e.g. builders) is taking place outside properties. JS confirmed it is as big a problem in the North of the Forest. The Board discussed the possibility of altering the car free ditching so that it better stops the vehicles from parking on verges. There are a couple of issues with this: the spoil from the ditches can't be placed on both sides of the ditch (often there will be a pile from previous ditch excavations) and if the new spoil is put on the opposite bank, we found that ponies were jumping the whole thing and landing in the road; the other issue is the extent of underground services that would need to be negotiated in order to move the ditchline. JT said there are some interesting and rare plants on the verges in the New Forest, for example in East Boldre one of the verges has Camomile growing.

	The Board agreed in principle to support this as a worthwhile project.	
	It was agreed to identify priority areas. The FC should let a contract for surveying where illegal parking is occurring, identify the extent of the damage and recommend priority areas for action.	JS
	The NFNPA is willing to work with the Parish Councils to do some form of education. AB to investigate potential funds for employing a project officer to deliver the education and co-ordinate any works on the ground.	АВ

	Item 9 – SAMs have to be restored and managed. The HLS agreement does not specify the number of other historic monuments to be restored but an aspiration of 10 per year was originally agreed by the partnership. There was a discussion about what makes something a historic monument. The Board agreed that they were not equipped with the knowledge to judge that.

	changes and are happy with the calculations for the reduction in payment. At present they are adding in those areas excluded during the inspection under the correct HLS option.	
	RPA Appeal (was Item 10 on the agenda). The Verderers are continuing with the appeal and have cited the 'Wednesbury' principal of reasonableness.

	Item 17 – OV thanked JS for providing the report on Cycle Counters out in the Forest. It appears the Ashley counter is not working, JS to follow up. The report shows the amount of illegal cycling is high. These original cycle counters were put out near to car parks that were known to be used by cyclists riding on the Forest illegally. The original HLS project was to erect signs in car parks that were confirmed (by the cycle counters) as having an illegal cycling problem saying 'No Forest Cycling from this Car Park'.	JS
	The health check has been delayed till the April meeting, to enable full data to be gathered.	
4. 2015 Programme Register	The Honey Buzzard survey needs deleting as Natural England are going to do this instead.	
	In the future LS is to send summary page from Programme Register out with the Board papers.	LS
5. FC Update	OV suggested that the FC lets contracts for the remaining 5 years of the scheme, but due to procurement rules within the Forestry Commission, this is restricted to a maximum of 4 years.	RESUME
	There is reference to a 3 year contract in the report and separately that Southern Counties Contractors has been awarded a contract. Clarification was sought whether this is one and the same contract. JS to check.	JS
	Bracken management appears to have been awarded to two contractors. JS to check.	JS
	A 4 year contract for the car free ditching has been awarded, so JS to look into the contract in case we need to revise the works on car free ditching.	JS
	Nick Wardlaw is coming up with a plan for the whole HLS monitoring, which factors in the Wetland Restoration Monitoring.	NW
6. New Forest Non-Native Plants Project Annual Report from HIWWT	Three quarters of the HLS funding was spent on the final report written by Dr Ewald. The report has been vital in telling us not to waste money on treating Crassula, as the treatments don't work. It also identified that our native species are still managing to survive in ponds affected by Crassula and this is due to grazing by livestock which is keeping the Crassula in check. The report said that the key element in managing Crassula is to stop the spread through having good bio-security. LS to distribute an executive summary of Dr Ewald's report to the Board. The report also should be uploaded on to the HLS website.	LS

	Holmsley bunker has not been blocked up yet and is scheduled for April. BR to investigate if it can be done immediately as it is a hazard to livestock.	BR
8. LiDAR	The Board were pleased with the work LSh has done on the LIDAR. He is achieved a great deal, especially to have caught up with the schedule from such a difficult start. LSh managed to achieve the goals for the year as well, despite it being only 10 months long. The Board would like to give their thanks to Lawrence Shaw.	
	HM to have a press release now to celebrate the half way mark with the LIDAR work.	HM, LSh
	The point was raised that the cost of doing a LIDAR flight has greatly reduced now and it could be useful for the wetland restoration work to have updated LIDAR data. The Board can consider this at the next meeting if costs are available.	
9. Bird Surveys	IB is going to share the bird reports with interested local groups. OV questioned the report's finding of a low number of Snipe in the Forest, as he felt he had seen more. This demonstrates the value of the report, as anecdotally it could be thought that Snipe were doing well, but many of these sightings could be the same individual displaying or more likely are sightings in the winter when Snipe are driven inland from the marshes. The survey was for breeding males in the summer and this is where numbers are low.	
	All surveys have recommendations in them to assess how we can improve the habitat for the species that is being surveyed. JT and MB are looking at what can be done to follow up the surveys with management for the species, but obviously some species are more difficult than others. For example with Slender cotton grass, which is only found in 3 sites, the survey recommendations can be implemented and management is being planned, whilst the bird species found in the Forest often have many impacts on their numbers and some are outside our control (such as the Dartford Warbler whose population numbers are severely hit if there is a bad winter). The Board would like to ensure that these reports don't just sit on shelves, but get used. However, it should be noted that often the recommendations conflict with other species.	JT, MB
	The Board decided to facilitate a Wildlife Forum where these aspects could be discussed and it would help others understand that there are many conflicting factors in the management of the Forest. It was suggested that the AGM should host this Forum with a discussion about wildlife on the Forest and how these surveys can be used to best effect. LS and OV to come up with some leading questions to start the discussion.	LS, OV
