DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

OV is a commoner & a member of the VGS; & is Chairman of the VGS Management Committee.

GF is a commoner & a member of the VGS.

AB declared an interest in all Wetland Restoration projects because of the NPA's responsibilities as local planning authority.

MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

Ideas for the AGM: talk on monitoring by the FC or NPA, explaining how we are using results and showing what work will be done to help; OV will do annual report; film clips from FC of wetland restoration; LSh to do a talk on LiDAR, Catherine Chatters re non-native plant control; Volunteer Certificate presentation (FC- Riverfly and Two Trees, NNIVP, LiDAR).

BR to chase Paul Grugeon re the Sports Clubs training; what has happened?

Due to mechanical issues with the forage harvester the bracken control and forage harvesting programme for 2014 could not be completed. The rest of the bracken management programme (including herbicide application, swiping and baling) was carried out. SLM to report to Board if we have caught up in 2015, detail what was target for 2014 and 2015, how much was actually done in 2015. Normally do 100ha and in 2015 did 190ha, which includes the Asulox treatment.

Pondhead Planning Application will go to the planning committee at the earliest March or April. The consultants are working on the topographical survey.

Cash flow for the Forestry Commission HLS expenditure in 2016 and for the remainder of the HLS, will not be a major issue, as the FC Director of Finance has agreed a more flexible approach.

VERGE RESTORATION PROJECT

There are two areas currently being restored:

- 1. Western Escarpment, which is being led by the Parish Councils, includes some FC work.
- 2. East Boldre which is in the planning stage, but should be carried out in 2016. AB to add it to the Quadrant meetings agendas, in order to engage the Parish Councils. Barry Dowsett is the lead contact for the Verderers.

SLM to ensure the Board receive a full update with costs, on both Western Escarpment & Action SLM East Boldre, at the next meeting.

PROGRAMME REGISTER AND SUMMARY

2015 sheet of the programme register:

Item 18 Drift fencing has not spent the whole budget as there was less work to do. Next year we are hoping to do some re-instatement around the water troughs.

Item 32 SAMs work was done, but the invoice has not yet come in; SLM to allocate it to 2015 when it comes in.

Item 68 Coppicing/Pollarding has no spend recorded, but there has been some fencing work done around the holly pollards as part of a trial. SLM to find out if there was a cost.

Item 103 Water Quality Sampling was only done for Latchmore as part of the EIA. The Board would like Water Sampling both before and after at all the 2016 restoration sites; additionally. after samples should be taken for all those sites completed in 2015. The Board would like a table showing timescales of sampling and works.

Item 56 Roe-Linford planning not done in 2015; the budget needs to be transferred into 2016. Item 80 Harvestslade wetland restoration went massively over the original estimate because of the cost of closing the layby on the A31 to relieve concerns over transport movements of materials. The FC will prepare more accurate estimates for future sites.

Total expenditure is missing from all years of the programme register. The Board want to see the final spend for 2015 at the April meeting.

2016 sheet of the programme register:

Item 70 needs the name changing to 'Verge Restoration'.

The following planning applications are scheduled to be submitted: Pondhead in April; Latchmore (Islands Thorns, Thompson's Castle and Latchmore) in February and Wootton in March.

Item 95 Denny Bog will move to 2017.

Dibden Bottom will be a smaller scheme than originally estimated.

Roe-Linford will require a new tender for the planning consultants.

Add Item for Interpretation and Education Officer - £26,000. The cost for December 2015 needs to be accrued.

2017 - 2019 sheets of the programme register:

Item 70 needs the name changing to 'Verge Restoration'. Add Item for Interpretation and Education Officer - £26,000.

FC UPDATE

Whitefield Moor: Board want it to be permanently open on one side, and if there are problems we will have to wire across temporarily. SLM to arrange to have the wire removed on one side, as per the Board's October decision.

Holmsley Bunker entrance must be filled in. SLM to inform Lucy Andrews.

Cycle signs should read 'No Forest Cycling from this Car Park' as agreed in 2011; BR to arrange changes.

In future reports, and on the programme register, the words 'repair and maintenance' are Action SLM preferred.

The table showing the list of recommendations that have been drawn from the surveys needs to explain more clearly what the management is trying to do. For example in the adder survey, it would be more clear if it said continue with existing open forest management. SLM to improve wording for next Board meeting.

SAMs: 2 were restored the last quarter of 2015, giving a total of 10 completed for the whole year.

SLM needs to prepare a tender for planning consultants, as we are unable to extend the existing contract as the contract has reached its procurement limit.

A Local Development Order is still a possibility, but once we have achieved positive outcomes for the current planning applications. An LDO would be more of a legacy for beyond the HLS.

Further bracken management trials were proposed at a cost of £42,000 split over 4 years. The Board did not approve the expenditure, so the further bracken survey will not go ahead.

WETLAND RESTORATION REVIEWS

The Verderers have received many complaints about wetland restoration work which it turns out were all sites that were contracted to Five Rivers. The Verderers had no complaints about the work carried out by Alaska and Farwells. Natural England said that the poor work could cause ecological issues as well. The Board is extremely disappointed with the work of Five Rivers. The Board feels very strongly that Five Rivers have proved themselves incapable of carrying out the sensitive nature of the work in the New Forest, and should not be given any further work.

In the review process, it was proposed that contractors were also scored on their good. A communications with the public around the site.

LIDAR UPDATE

LSh to change the statistical year from 2015/16 to report just on the calendar year, January to December 2015, and future calendar years.

The Board is pleased with the on-going LiDAR analysis, and applauds the success of the exhibition.

NON-NATIVE INVASIVE PLANTS PROJECT ANNUAL REPORT

setting up a Living Record for Non-Native Invasive Plants as per the paper.

REMOVAL OF CONCRETE AND TARMAC FROM AROUND THE FOREST

The Board agreed a new project to remove areas of old concrete or tarmac on the open Forest that remains, for example from the second world war. Any areas to be removed would need to have the approval of the Archaeologist at the National Park Authority. AB to find out what extent of information is already held by the Historic Environment team, and come up

Re-instatement would involve removing the concrete or tarmac and, if required, infilling with hoggin.
