### **DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST**

OV is Chairman of the VGS Management Committee.

AB declared an interest in all Wetland Restoration projects because of the NPA's responsibilities as local planning authority.

RS is a member of the VGS and a committee member of the CDA.

### MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

Lawrence Shaw the NPA Archaeologist gave the board a presentation on Anonymised phone data. The board asked LS to approach the phone companies and request a representative to address the board with a sample of the data available from the New Forest area.

### FC Report

JT advised the board to start considering the compilation of an end of scheme report based on the annual health checks. AB to report to the next board with suggested content. NW asked TW to supply the draft 2017 health check report to the HLS team and JT as soon as possible.

### PROGRAMME AND SUMMARY

DS confirmed that following instruction from HMRC the 2<sup>nd</sup> half of the year's figures now included VAT. DS to forward HMRC correspondence to OV & TW to keep on file.

The board discussed the current underspend and the options of legitimate projects that could now be included in the HLS scheme. The haloing of ancient Oaks, Turkey Oak removal and removal of conifers from open heaths at certain locations were suggested as possible projects under the scheme. AB asked for the FC, in consultation with JT, to produce a list and quantification of possible projects for the board to consider.

RS commented that all these terrestrial works are supported by the CDA and they would add their suggestions to the proposal.

Action SLM

DS raised the risk that project staff whose contracts would end at the end of the scheme in February 2020 are likely to be considering alternative employment opportunities towards the end of the scheme. AB reiterated the urgency of having a future agreement and that she would ideally like to see a costed plan to illustrate to government what it really costs to run the Forest.

The board studied the 2018 programme and the OV expressed an interest in the Hen Harrier Monitoring. JT informed the board that there are very few left in the country now and that the New Forest offers the unique habitat that attracts overwintering birds. The monitoring of this species requires onerous data collection over the winter months. AB asked if other data could be collected at the same time. JT will look into the possibility.

### FC UPDATE

#### Wetland Restoration

NW hopes for a good season on the wetland restoration projects.

NW has been engaging with the consultation groups on the projects and engaging with the PC's.

JT reported that the Freshwater and Wetland Restoration Strategy Group workshop has taken place and the follow up meeting will take place around February/March, this will eventually lead to a future restoration strategy for the whole of the New Forest SSSI. The OV commented that this would then be aligned to the HLS.

DS reported that the 2019 projects are now in the consultative planning stages. NW confirmed that the base line surveys are in progress.

DS asked the board to consider a contingency plan for the end of 2020 in case the final projects are running late.

#### Terrestrial Restoration

NW reported on his summary. OV requested dates for the Lost Lawns Consultation days. NW to forward to OV.

**Action NW** 

JT thought that during the process of ridge and furrow clearance there was a good opportunity to create new ponds. AB remarked that the LiDAR may show historical sites. OV also thought it would be worth looking at old photographs of the areas.

JT recommended that newly felled areas should be first to have the ridge and furrows removed. The board agreed to provide the funds to unlock the resources (e.g. Archaeological surveys) needed to get the project completed this season. NW commented that a framework of contractors will then be in place for future years.

### Verge Restoration

NW reported on his summary. JT reminded the FC that all verge restoration works require NE consent before work commences.

## Wetland Restoration Monitoring

NW reported on his summary. JT discussed the need to deliver a report on progress of the monitoring by the end of the agreement, demonstrating the change from beginning to end. DS felt that there is a need to be proactive on communicating the data collected through the monitoring. The board discussed the possibility of getting a consultancy to produce a progress report.

### LAND ADVICE SERVICE WRITTEN UPDATE

The board studied the report from the NFLAS. AB commented that the LAS are a small part of the scheme, but very worth the input. DS requested a report on the Young Commoners evening. RS will forward report to the DS.

# ENGAGEMENT AND INTERPRETATION OFFICER WRITTEN REPORT

The report supplied was studied by the board. AB asked whether the board felt the engagement activity needs to be increased. NW commented that at present the HLS are spending a lot of time communicating with people. OV felt that early engagement especially with the PC's was very important. AB said she would organise an FC engagement with the NPA Quadrant Meetings.

#### LIDAR WRITTEN REPORT

The board studied the report on the ongoing work by the NPA team which continues to support the other HLS projects.

### HIWWT WRITTEN UPDATE

OV felt this project was a terrific example of changing people's opinions on nonnative plants. The board agreed what a success this project has been. The DS asked JT if there was a current programme for the removal of Turkey oaks. JT replied currently not but that a programme could be reintroduced. RS informed the board that there had been a project under the LIFE scheme.

#### HLS EDUCATION ACCESS ANNUAL REPORT

The board studied the annual report supplied by the Education Access team. The board agreed it was a great success and is of huge benefit to the scheme.
